


100 km full day drive around the main lava plug of the remnant Tweed shield volcano \*\* Suggest drive in counter-clockwise direction (along Tyalgum Rd first) \*\* Does not allow for time to climb Mt Warning summit \*\* Sealed roads except sections of Byrrill Creek Rd. \*\* Suitable for standard vehicles \*\* Road closures during flooding rains \*\* The Mt Warning summit (elevation 1160m) is a remnant lava plug of the exposed 'deep plumbing' of this volcano, once 2,000m high \*\* 'Wollumbin' is the Aboriginal name for Mt Warning (not to be confused with Mt Wollumbin, a landform just to the north-east).




**Murwillumbah Visitors Centre**

Comprehensive visitor and events information, Tweed shield volcano interpretive videos, gift shop, Caldera Art Gallery, and Green Cauldron Panorama. Surrounding parklands have rainforest gardens with tree identification chart available from the Centre.



**Caldera Art Gallery**

Within the Murwillumbah Visitors Centre, the CAG includes the Green Cauldron Panorama, a 20 m long painting of the views from the Mt Warning summit. Artworks by local artists inspired by the landscapes and biodiversity values of the Tweed region.




**Budd Park**

Budd Park, adjacent to the Visitors Centre, has riverside picnic facilities. Views from the Murwillumbah Bridge of Mt Warning, Mt Wollumbin and Mt Nullum (with Tweed River in the foreground).




**Treasures of the Tweed**

Along Commercial Rd, a 700m long mural painted on the flood levee wall depicts the natural history, landscapes and biodiversity values of the Tweed region.




**Old Lismore Road**

Views from roadside verges before Oxley River crossing. No thru road. Landforms visible from south to west: Mt Nullum, Hattons Bluff, Mt Uki, Mt Wollumbin, Mt Warning, and Three Tops.



**Eungella**

Sights from roadside verges 100m+ past McMahons Bridge. Mt Wollumbin to the left (privately owned) with Three Tops to the right of Mt Warning summit. Extensive banana plantations visible on steep slopes.



**Tyalgum Village**

View of Mt Warning summit from main street, best light during late afternoon. Historical timber village full of character.




**Yellowwood Rd**

Surprising views from roadside verge near end of no through road.




**Pinnacle Rd**

Dramatic view of The Pinnacle, from below, at the end of a no through road.




**Brays Creek Rd**

From roadside verges (before stockyards), panoramas of Border Ranges (incl The Pinnacle) to the west, Mt Warning summit to the east. No thru rd. parts unsealed



**Mebbin National Park**

Well maintained facilities, including toilets, at Cutters Campground. Short walk (450m) down to creek and giant fig tree in small patch of rainforest.



**Byrrill Creek**

Parking at quaint little picnic table & shelter. Glimpse of summit above distant treeline. With good binoculars and clear weather conditions, climbers may be seen ascending the peak.



**Palmers Rd**

Tweed River rock-pools and riparian forest. Views from roadside verges of Mt Warning summit and The Sisters.




**Kyogle Rd**

View from roadside verges after Slow Vehicle Turnout sign. Summit has a 'benign' shape from this angle. The Sisters peaks to the right.




**Clarrie Hall Dam**

Well maintained picnic facilities including toilets. Excellent historic and cultural interpretation signage. Short walk extends near and along the waterway. Gates close at 5pm (6pm DST), open 7.30am daily.



**Uki Village**

Views of the summit from the Mt Warning Hotel. Sweetnam Park (near Smith's Creek bridge) has community tree planting area, picnic facilities and playground. Possible sightings of platypus in Tweed River. Paved walkway to Uki village.



**Braeside Drive**

Framed view from roadside verge. Mt Uki to the left, Mt Warning summit at its most abrupt from this angle.



**Mt Warning Rd - Wollumbin NP**

A close sight of summit from roadside is 300m back from Breakfast Creek car park (very busy during week-ends). Sub-tropical rainforest and boulder-strewn creek along short Lyrebird Walk.
